Deer Park Local's Cool Invention

In early 2015, Deer Park City Councilmember Ron Martin heard his wife remark that her YETI tumbler was too large and uncomfortable to hold, and she wished it had a handle. Ron rigged her a make-shift handle, which quickly drew attention and requests from friends and family. After realizing the popularity of the simple design, Ron and business partner, Joe Terry, started researching the idea of producing their own brand of tumbler handle. Patents were filed and fast forward to only a few short months later when The HANDL'R entered the market. Over 80,000 units were sold in its first year of production through



online, local and regional retailers. Ron recently licensed the HANDL'R products to Boelter Brands under the H2X line, which means the HANDL'R will soon be sold nationally. You can also purchase the Deer Park-born device at www.thehandlr.com.

MOD Pizza will open later this summer at 9315 Spencer Highway (in the Junction at Deer Park retail center next door to H-E-B's gas station). They serve up individual artisan-style pizzas and salads, which are made on demand. Customers can design their own pizzas and salads or select from a menu of MOD classics. All are the same price regardless of toppings. The handcrafted pizzas are fired in an 800 degree display oven and ready to eat in less than 5 minutes.
